Michelle Hadley, DO, FACC

Michelle L. Hadley DO FACC, is a Cardiologist, educator and dedicated public health advocate at Saint Vincent Hospital. She has a specific focus on leadership, education and strategy. She has worked across a breadth of global organizations, focusing on local public health awareness as well as advocacy for the American College of Cardiology. Dr. Hadley is an active member and recent President of the American Heart Association for the central MA chapter. She has several publications to her credit in various academic disciplines. She has led "The Physicians for Social Responsibility, National chapter" leading the nation in gun violence awareness. Dr. Hadley has worked with many legislators to improve patient care throughout the country. She is the co-chair MA Women In Cardiology representative. She holds a passion, for not only public awareness, but also for education. She has been active in teaching Residents, Fellows, Physician Assistant students as well as medical students, college and high school students. Dr. Hadley has developed The Women's Health and Lifestyle Center, the Cardiac-Obstetrics clinic and started the Adult Congenital Heart disease clinic at St. Vincent Hospital. She was the cofounder of the Women's Health Clinic for then Fallon Clinic. She is Co-director of the Healer's Art Program at University of Massachusetts Medical School, and she is the recipient of countless Community Service and Humanity awards.

While Dr. Lochrie's passion is serving the underserved population, she has a strong interest in working with and guiding students and residents through the many facets of their training. Dr. Lochrie has literally mentored hundreds of medical students, residents and colleagues during her 32 years at St. Vincent hospital.
